The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

#### WITHOUT SUNDAY WE CANNOT LIVE

This time last year, we were still unable to gather together for Mass, let alone to celebrate Corpus Christi. The experience of lockdown and deprivation of Mass has been an awful experience for us for whom the Mass is everything. And why is the Mass everything? Well, to begin with, we simply respond to the Lord's commandment: *Do this in memory of me*. Reflecting further on his words, we realise that we do not take part in an act of remembrance alone, but that there is something real here. He told us: *This is my body; this is the chalice of my blood*. We are aware that the Apostles understood him to mean this truly and really, and that they gathered for the Breaking of Bread, accompanied by reading the Scriptures and prayers, with hymns and psalms.

By faith, we become aware that we not only enact a ritual, but take part in a sacred reality: we are present at the mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection. In our spiritual lives, in prayer, we realise that the Lord is here. He is present. We realise that he comes inside of us to live within us and to nourish us: he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him.

But this year, we surely also realise with relief how much we need the Mass. In 302, the Christians of Abitinae, faced with the Emperor Diocletian's prohibition on possessing the Scriptures, celebrating the Eucharist or building churches, declared: "sine dominico non possumus" – We cannot live without Sunday. They were martyred for it. For them, the Eucharist was everything – their life, their identity, the very sustenance of their souls, without which they would be adrift personally and socially.

A few years ago, Fr. Ragheed Ganni (who had studied at the Irish College, Rome and worked during the summers at Lough Derg), explained to the Eucharistic Congress at Bari in 2005 that, for the people of his native Iraq, the same was true: in the face of terrible danger to their lives, the Christians gathered for the Sunday Eucharist: without Sunday they could not live. Two years later, on the 3rd June 2007, he gave his life for them when he was gunned down with three sub-deacons after Mass at his parish church of the Holy Spirit.

There are many who bear the name of Christian today, it must be recognised, who, although washed in baptism by the blood of Christ, approach Sunday and its Eucharist with indifference, often completely unaware, despite our ancient Christian culture, of what the Eucharist is; many simply do not understand that the Eucharist is Christ himself, sacramentally and truly.

The lockdown prohibitions are surely a moment when every Catholic Christian must ask themselves: do we, with our brothers and sisters of ancient Abitinae, modern day Iraq, and countless other places, declare by word, action and attitude: without Sunday we cannot live?

# Please note the following guidelines for attending Mass under current Covid-19 restrictions:

- You may come each weekend to your allocated Mass.
- It is not necessary to have a seat allocated for weekday Mass.
- Please leave 10 am Mass to the elderly and those with underlying conditions.
- Please leave Friday Evening Masses/Month's Mind Masses/First Anniversary Masses to the families of the deceased.
- Please follow this simple principle when taking a seat: TWO PEOPLE PER PEW, OR ONE HOUSEHOLD.
- Please **observe the two metre rule** when entering the Cathedral, going for Holy Communion or exiting the Cathedral, and at all times both inside and in the grounds of the Cathedral.
- Please wear a mask in the Cathedral unless a medical condition prevents you from doing so. This is for your own protection and out of consideration for those in the Cathedral with you.
- Please **do not attend the Cathedral** if you have a cough, sneezing or any signs of Covid-19.
- Please sanitise your hands upon entrance and exit.
- Please **do not** congregate at the doors or in the Cathedral grounds.
- 1. **FUNERALS** will take place from Monday Saturday at 11 am.
- 2. There will be **NO Sunday Funerals** at the Cathedral for the time being.
- 3. The congregation should not exceed 50 mourners (close family and close friends). Social distancing must be adhered to for entry, exit and seating.
- 4. All present should wear masks if at all possible.
- 5. At the graveside, it remains important to maintain the two metre rule.
- ◆ **BAPTISMS** are being celebrated separately for each child: Saturday and Sunday: 2.30 pm and 4 pm. (Times may vary according to our schedule)
- Presently, Parents, child (children) and two Godparents permitted.
- Public health guidance requires that there be no unnecessary movement in public settings. Therefore, it will not be possible to have group photography or movement beyond the baptistery. One person should be asked to photograph the ceremony; these can be shared with others present.
