The Mass - The Liturgy of the Word: The Creed

From the earliest times, the Church has recited creeds, a series of statements that express the most fundamental elements of our faith. Even the New Testament has basic 'creedal statements'. The creed was used principally for the baptismal statement of faith of those wishing to enter into the faith. It is unsurprising that at the weekly gathering of the baptised for the Eucharistic celebration - the Mass - the creed should be recited, since only those who profess the one faith can partake of the one bread. As St. Paul puts it: "Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" [1 Corinthians 10:17]. There are three formulas of creed used in the Mass. The first is the renewal of baptismal promises, which is used at Easter and may be used throughout the year but particularly during the Easter season. The format makes use of the second formula, which is the Apostles Creed, has its roots in the creed used in Rome as far back as the fourth century. It is shorter and we are used to saying it at the beginning of many of our prayers, for example the Rosary. On most Sundays and solemnities, we use the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed, a combination of the creeds devised by the Council of Nicaea [325] and the Council of Constantinople [360]. This fundamental statement of the faith has been professed throughout the Christian world from that time to this, and holds pride of place in the Church's profession of faith. To recite the creed at Sunday Mass is to remind ourselves that our faith is not only a deeply personal relationship with God, but also a profession of something that has been revealed, given and taught by Christ, through the Apostles and in the teaching of the Church. We profess one faith by confessing or acknowledging that we have received it, and that it forms the basis of the unity in one body that is formed by communion in the one faith.
