

# THE MASS – THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST – THE OFFERTORY [CONTINUED]

On more solemn occasions, it is the custom for the bread and wine to be brought forward in procession by the faithful and given to the celebrant just as the offertory begins. This practice has its roots in the early days of the Church, when the basic materials for Mass – bread and wine – was brought by the people who had baked and produced it, along with offerings for the poor. The offertory procession also has a profound symbolic meaning. The bread and wine were the staples of daily living – and remain so in many countries – and so represent the entire life and work of the people being brought to be transformed into the body and blood of the Lord. But at the Mass, our own lives, both individually and as the Church, are transformed. We form the elements consecrated by the Lord, "bread broken for a new world". As bread is baked from many grains gathered, crushed, mixed and baked, so the baptised are grains gathered, crushed in common sacrifice, bound together by the Spirit and baked by his holy flame. One ancient text from the first century puts it like this: "Even as this broken bread was scattered over the hills, and was gathered together and became one, so let Thy Church be gathered together from the ends of the earth into Thy kingdom" [The Didaché or Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, Chapter 9, paragraph 3]. Therefore, the deep symbolic and spiritual association of the people with the offerings reminds us of the twofold work of consecration and transformation: of the bread and wine into the sacramental body of Christ and of the baptised into the ecclesial body of Christ. It is not only that each one of us experiences this ongoing spiritual transformation by participating in the whole action of the Mass (and not only in receiving the Eucharist), but the whole Church of which we are the many grains is consecrated and transformed continually. As one ancient Father puts it, it is not that we receive the Lord into ourselves, but we are received into the Lord: "If we receive the Eucharist worthily, we become what we receive" (Augustine, Easter Sermon, 227).
