THE JUBILEE; A TIME OF HOPE

Every twenty-five years, the Popes call a Jubilee Year for the whole Church. It calls our attention with greater emphasis on the mystery of our salvation: that God looked upon humanity which had wandered away in sin, took upon himself our human condition and was born of a Virgin who is most beautiful from the first moment of her being. Pope Francis has given to this Jubilee Year the theme of hope. We may look about us and find good reasons why he may have felt that hope is something we need and of which we need reminding, for often there are many reasons for despairing. We hear of wars, oppression, destruction and injustice, the terrible drama of so many families who live in places where there is danger or lack of opportunity. Many of them live among us now as brothers and sisters in the one faith and they seek but one thing: to build a future for themselves and for their children. It is a noble aspiration that is instinct to every human person. When we encourage one another in noble things, we build the future for ourselves as well as for others. Then there is the challenge of our own young; challenges of a society that we feel we have no influence over, challenges of attaining to those basic aspirations of the human heart: to build a family, to provide, to shelter, to make a home, a place of safety and the cradle of community.

There are, of course, the perennial challenges of ill-health, misfortune, and the sufferings we too often endure from the hearts and actions of others, often those from whom we should be able to expect more. But challenges will never be lacking. It is the human condition in this fallen world. The Jubilee of Hope turns our attention to the Christian virtue of hope. This virtue looks soberly at the world with great realism but places before itself not only the desire for what is good, but an acknowledgment that goodness comes to us from the word of truth born in our flesh, the Son of the Eternal Father. Moreover, the desire for this goodness must be an interior conviction that makes us ready to sacrifice for it, indeed even to suffer for it. This deep and robust interior conviction, or rather this confident acknowledgement that the good is not of our making but is the eternal truth of God himself, gives to the Christian a

resilience that is prepared to encounter every circumstance of life knowing that it is not the last word. Indeed, when we look upon the Child in the manger, we realise, for all that lay before him for our salvation, he has already won the only victory that matters — the victory over sin and death. Whatever other defeats we must face, the only victory that matters has already been achieved, and God will bring order to chaos, life where death subsists, and hope to carry us to his final word spoken in truth and love. The poet Brendan Kennelly once expressed something of this in his poem, Begin:

Though we live in a world that dreams of ending that always seems about to give in something that will not acknowledge conclusion insists that we forever begin.
