

# THE MASS – THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST – THE OFFERTORY [continued]

After the offering of the bread, the priest prepares the chalice by pouring wine into it and adding a drop of water with the prayer, said quietly: "by the mixture of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity". Wine has powerful biblical resonances. The vineyard itself is a sign of God's blessing and fidelity to his people, and in particular it stands for the nation of Israel, planted by God and protected by him, given water for its flourishing and giving its fruit to him for his honour. When Israel fell away from fidelity to the Law and the Covenant, the divine grief is described as one looked over a vineyard that had produced bitter fruit [cf. Isaiah 5]. Similarly, Jesus compares his Kingdom to a vineyard, where all who labour to produce its fruit will be rewarded according to the logic of God's generosity, beyond human logic or ken [cf. Matthew 20:1-16]. Jesus is himself the vine, and we the branches [John 15:5], and from us he will produce the fruit which is he himself. At the last supper he told the apostles that he would not drink again of the fruit of the vine until he would take the new wine of the Kingdom. From the vine of the cross, Christ pours forth his blood for our salvation [cf. John 19:34], from which we joyfully draw living water from the wells of salvation [cf. Isaiah 12:3]. The first miracle of Jesus sees him turn water into the richest wine, in a quantity that is excessive in its abundance. This prefigures the new wine of the Kingdom flowing from his side, the living water of the Eucharist and of grace. The beautiful prayer of the preparation of the chalice calls to mind that our humanity is caught up in the divinity of Jesus, who is the eternal Son of the Father, and that, in our baptism, we share in the divinity of him who shared in our humanity. It also reminds us of that great hymn of St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians: [Jesus], though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant [Phil. 2:6-7]. Like the bread, wine, "the work of human hands", is destined to be filled with God's life and glory, "that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father [Philippians 2:10-11].

There will be a **SERVICE OF VESPERS** to mark the **WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY** in the Cathedral on Thursday 25th January at 8 pm, the feast of the Conversion of the Apostle Paul. All are most welcome.
