

THE MASS – THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST – THE OFFERTORY [continued]

Having bowed low before the altar and the offerings for the sacrifice of the Mass the priest may then proceed to the incensation of the offertory. This is a powerful visual representation of the nature of the sacrifice that rises up to God "like an evening oblation". The use of incense was a natural symbol from the earliest times of the faith, as it had been used in the Temple and is referenced frequently in the Old Testament [cf. Psalm 141:2, Exodus 30:1, 1 Chronicles 28:18], particularly Leviticus 16:12-13 referencing the offering of incense in the Holy of Holies of the Temple on the Day of Atonement – a reference taken up by the author of the Letter to the Hebrews [9:3-4]. The vision of the heavenly liturgy in the Book of Revelations likewise describes how the prayers of God's people went up before God from burning censers [Revelations 5:8]. While incensing the gifts, the priest may say the antiphon "May this incense, blessed by You, ascend to You O Lord, and may your mercy descend upon us". First the bread and chalice are incensed, then the altar cross, and then the altar. Thereafter, the celebrant may be incensed [and should be when the Bishop celebrates], followed by the other clergy and then the entire congregation. It is not merely a gesture of respect or blessing: it signifies the offering up of their prayers in the sight of God.

After the incensation, when it takes place, the priest then proceeds to the lavabo or the washing of his hands, saying quietly the words: "Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin". While this gesture – like many of the gestures of the Mass - may have begun life for a practical reason, namely to wash hands before handling the bread and the chalice, it nevertheless captures so much of the spiritual tradition received from the Scriptures [the Old Testament]. The Jewish rituals involved much washing of hands - one has only to think of the six stone water jars at Cana meant for the "ablutions" following the wedding feast, and Jesus was challenged about why his disciples did not wash as the rituals set down; he replied with a stinging criticism that contrasts mere ritualism with the reality the ritual should signify [cf. Matthew 15:1-20]. The prayer of the lavabo is derived from Psalm 26:6-7, and it directs the priest as it does every participant that our hearts must be ready for what our hands will perform and hold. The Eucharist is the sacrifice and the food that sustains those washed in baptism in their union with Jesus, who alone is holy and whose sacrifice alone is acceptable before the Father.
