THE MASS – THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST – THE OFFERTORY [continued]

After the offering of the chalice, the Celebrant invites the people to make a specific prayer: "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father". In response, the people reply: "May the Lord accept this offering at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church". The people address their prayer to the Lord – meaning to God the Father, reminding us that when we pray to Jesus as Lord we pray to him as Son in the union of the Trinity: we pray to God, three in one and one in three. We ask that our offering may be accepted. The offering is not merely the elements of bread and wine that will be transformed, but the prayer of the heart and indeed the very life we give as a living sacrifice offered up in union with Christ and by the power of his grace. The hands of the priest make this offering on our behalf, literally holding it up in a gesture of offering at various moments of the Mass that is to come. This gesture recalls the gesture of the priests of the Old Testament at the moment of the evening offering whose purpose was indeed to give "praise and glory" to God. This is the first purpose of the sacrificial action, the action of praise and the imitation of the Lord's own action when he lifted up his hands to offer the evening sacrifice on the cross: "Let my prayer arise before you like incense, the raising of my hands like an evening oblation", the psalmist writes in Psalm 141 (v.2). To give praise and glory to God is to be filled – almost transported – with love and joy for His goodness and love: "I will bless the Lord all my days, his praise always on my lips" we read in Psalm 34 (v.2). The Lord Jesus took the cup at the Last Supper and praised God; he raised his eyes to heaven in praise before the multiplication of the loaves and fish, and he gave thanks to God for hiding the mysteries from the learned and the clever and revealing them to mere children (cf. Mt. 11:25-27). This action of praise has a twofold purpose that flows from the goodness of God: it is for our personal good and the good of the Holy Church. This reminds us of the twofold mystery of which we must be conscience when we speak of the Mass and participate in it: it is not only for the good of the one who participates – a deeply personal good in particular graces needed or given to us individually, and the objective good of the grace of the sacrament; it is also for the good of the whole Church, particularly the

Church a pilgrim upon this earth, a witness to Christ the Lord and the place where God is worshipped as He desires to be – in spirit and in truth (cf. John 4:24). The Mass is, in fact, an action of the whole Church before it is ever a personal experience of participation. It is an action of the whole Church not only in the sense of its members here below, but all her members – in heaven and on earth and in Purgatory. In this sense, it is the Mass of the ages, the same yesterday, today and tomorrow. It is by this understanding that we speak of holy Church, since she has a holiness that belongs to her as Christ's body, distinct altogether from the collective holiness of her saints and unmitigated by the sinfulness of her members who battle with weakness, corruption and sin.
